TRANSPORTATION @ MIT

 "A 2008 survey of 1,300 MIT faculty and senior researchers revealed that 338, or 26% of those surveyed, are doing work related to or applicable to transportation."

TRANSPORT PLATFORM

 A cross-disciplinary, cross-university initiative at the Swedish Royal Institute of Technology: rethinking how to organize programs

AT NORTHWESTERN

- Transportation Center founded in 1954
 recognizing Transportation as cross-disciplinary scholarly domain with considerable importance to society
